It holds deep spiritual significance, representing beliefs about creation and encompassing identity, culture, autonomy, and environmental respect. Efforts to reclaim traditional names and promote Indigenous place names are underway, challenging the anglicization of the continent's name and honoring Indigenous perspectives.
